You Said...We Did...

You said – We are concerned about the amount of asbestos debris around the village following the Fairport fire - We have checked with Chorley Council and despite differences between the site owners and their insurers the work to clear the debris is continuing seven days a week. Any further serious concerns should be reported to Chorley Council.

You said – We are concerned about the fading road markings and lights on the pedestrian crossings, and mini roundabouts on Market Street, between the White Bear public house and The Retreat Restaurant –We contacted the Highways department and the lights on both crossings have been cleaned and the lighting improved. The road markings are also being repainted at our request.

You said – We are concerned about the amount of dog fouling on the streets – We have asked for the yellow pavement signs "no dog fouling" to be repainted around the village, this has already been completed in some areas. We are asking all dog owners to act responsibly and clear up after their own pets.



You said – We are concerned about the proposed reduction in opening hours of the Household Waste Recycling sites and the amount of litter around the village – we have responded to Lancashire County Council stating that the reduction in opening hours is regrettable and disappointing in an age where recycling is growing in importance and that proposed changes will not allow working residents access to the sites before or after work – we have asked them to consider more flexible options. In order to protect our own environment and the areas where we live we also ask all residents to recycle as much as possible and to encourage all members of their families to take their litter home. A proposal for a "community litter pick" will be considered at the next Town Council Meeting.

You Said – We are concerned about the continuing poor rail services to the village – we have had lengthy correspondence to and from Northern Rail and discussions including an open forum with residents at our January and February Town Council Meetings. We have sent the following question to County Councillor Kim Snape to submit to the relevant cabinet members before the next full County Council meeting "After many years of disruption in Adlington village and promises of a golden future of rail travel, when will Adlington commuters receive an enhanced and improved service and additional scheduled rail services at Adlington Station?"

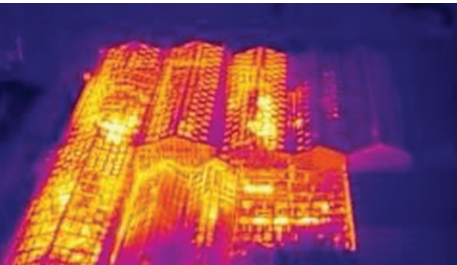

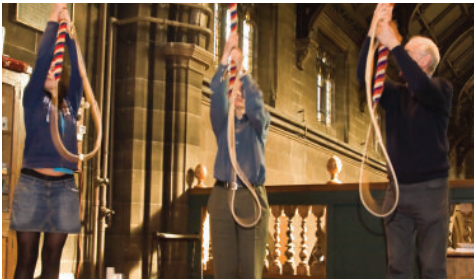
Adlington wartime casualties

Much has been written over the years about the servicemen from the Borough during the two world wars and even though I've always tried to be inclusive of all those who served and highlight that women from our community served as well, their involvement is often forgotten. Women served in a number of branches of the armed forces and also with civilian organisations in a supporting capacity. Amongst other groups, during the lead up to World War Two the British Government remobilised the Women's Land Army. Their task was to fill the void in agricultural employment when the bulk of the male population embarked for war. Work included dairy production, tractor driving and pest control. A few women from Chorley borough lost their lives during the two world wars and are listed on local war memorials. I have recently come across a Chorley Guardian article from 1943 which mentions another young lady who lost her life whilst on war service but she is not named on any memorial.

Elsie Rawlinson was the daughter of Fred and Sarah and was born on 5th May 1924. In 1939 the family was living at 3 Grimeford Lane, just outside of Adlington and she was a towel weaver. It was reported that Elsie died in September 1943 in Radnorshire, Wales after the tractor she was driving overturned. She was only 19 years old when she died and had been a member of Adlington Parish Church and the Girl Guides. As we have just gone over the 75th anniversary of her death as a result of war service I would very much like to hear from any surviving family. Whilst she

may not be seen as an official war casualty, but for the war she would not have lost her life in such tragic circumstances, and so I would like to see to it that she is appropriately remembered from now on.
