This year's recipients were as follows:

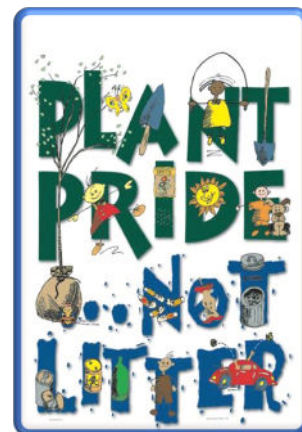
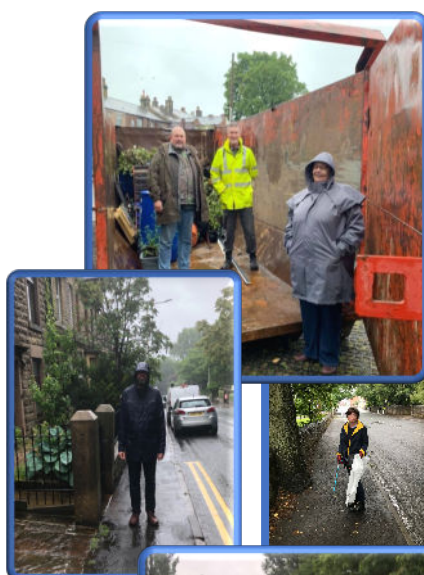
- Adlington & District in Bloom - Planter sponsorship - £300

ANNUAL REPORT

Finance The precept requested in 2018 was £18,500, the same amount as in previous years. Chorley Council provided additional grant funding for the Town Council as in previous years so that the charge to individual residents was in fact reduced due to an increase in the "tax base" for the area due to the building of additional properties.

Grants totalling £2000 were awarded by the Town Council to local organisations who applied through the Community Awards scheme.

Expenditure in 2018-19 included the purchase of lamp post poppies and a "silent soldier" placed at the war memorial.

Additional Community Infrastructure Funding received in 2017/18 was brought forward with the intention of contributing towards the King George V recreation ground improvements planned by Chorley Council, although no date has yet been set for these to commence.

The full report and appendix will give more details of the 2018/19 income and expenditure as well as further information on Councillors, village matters, planning, meetings, events and representation. The report is available on the council website or by request from Adlington Town Council Clerk.

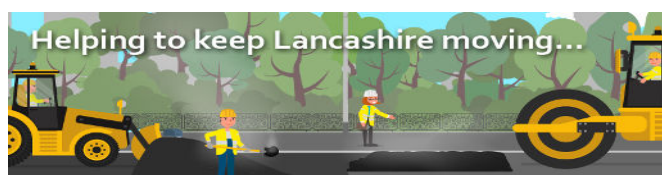

YOU SAID WE DID.....

You said ...we are concerned about the closure of the Co-op in Lower Adlington and the impact on residents with mobility or transport issues. One of our Town Councillors contacted the Co-op organisation and has been told that the shop was not commercially viable. The Council is aware that small towns and villages around the country are losing retail outlets and welcomes any suggestions which would help to prevent this. The future of the Co-op site is not yet known, the Council has contacted Stagecoach and LCC to ask for improvements to local bus services to enable access for residents to alternative shops.

You said ...the increase in burglaries, theft, petty crime and anti-social behaviour in the village is of growing concern, Adlington Town Council have had frequent communication with the police at all levels including the Police and Crime Commissioner for Lancashire, we have asked for more detail of the crime figures given to us and also for clarification on current and future plans for policing in Adlington. A Police Sgt has attended the Adlington Town Council meeting in July to answer questions from the councillors and members of the public. A summary of the discussion can be found in the July minutes.

You said ... developers Hollins Strategic Land have applied again for planning permission for 25 houses near Carrington Road although objections would remain the same as their previous refused application. Adlington Town Council considered the new application and registered objections with Chorley Council to contribute to the decision to be made at their planning meeting. The application has been refused. Hollins Strategic Land have now taken this to an appeal.



You can have your say on your roads and transport locally by completing a short survey. As part of a new campaign to promote the work of their highways service, Lancashire County Council is encouraging people to complete the National Highways and Transport (NHT) survey, which measures public satisfaction with services across different local authorities.

The campaign will also focus on their work fixing around 40,000 potholes a year and ask people to report potholes on their website. This year, the council will spend £24m to maintain Lancashire's 4,600 miles of highways and 5,300 miles of footways. Continued investment has improved the condition of the county's roads and helped to reduce the number of potholes by 38% in the last two years.
