- **Mrs Gillian Pilkington** – for raising charitable funds through dance from childhood as a performer and through her own Dance School giving children the opportunity to take part to raise money for many national and local charitable causes.
- **The Police Officers in the Chorley Rural East team:** PCSO Fern Jones, PCSO Ben Pilling, and PC 3932 Carl Exley for the team's role in: community safety; fostering practical working relationships and by engaging with young people leading to the successful setting-up of the Adlington Youth Group as a

new initiative which young people have responded to very positively.

The Stephen Higgins Junior Citizen Award, 2023 will be made to:
