On the 8th May we observed VE Day, otherwise known as Victory in Europe Day, when the war came to an end. We held a short wreath laying ceremony at the Adlington & District War Memorial on Railway Road, it was very well attended.

The service was hosted by then Deputy Mayor Cllr Stuart Clewlow and was supported by Clergy from St Paul's Church and Adlington United Reformed & Methodist Church. Wreaths were laid by then Mayor Cllr Kim Snape, the Chair of Heath Charnock Parish Council and John Speers on behalf of local Veterans.

After the service, St Paul's Church provided refreshments at the Church Club and we were able to enjoy a display of local military artefacts, loaned by Cllr Clewlow for the Church Clubs very successful VE Day party on Saturday 10th.

On the 15th of August, we will gather to acknowledge VJ Day, known as Victory over Japan, and the conclusion of World War Two. The service and sacrifice of our Armed Forces and those of our Allies should be honoured. Adlington Town Council will host a short wreath laying ceremony at the Adlington & District War Memorial on Railway Road, starting at 10.45.
